Breast Pumps

It is important to prepare for your breast pumping needs before you deliver. It is also important to research and carefully consider the type of pump you decide to use. While wearable pumps can be very useful, they often are not as effective at removing milk as a standard double electric pump. This can lead to low milk supply, clogged ducts, and mastitis.

Community Pharmacy now dispenses the Spectra SI Plus Double Electric Breast Pump, which may be covered by insurance. While we hope that all patients can get their pump before delivery, if you are unable to do so, Regional West's Meds-to-Beds delivery program can be utilized to get your pump before hospital dismissal. We also have a small number of pumps available in the Birth and Infant Center if you deliver and are discharged over the weekend when the Community Pharmacy is closed.

If you prefer a different type of pump, we also utilize Aeroflow Breastpumps. To see if you are eligible for insurance coverage, visit Aeroflow Breastpumps' website and fill out their online application.
