

Breast Pumps

It is important to prepare for your breast pumping needs before you deliver. It is also important to research and carefully consider the type of pump you decide to use. While wearable pumps can be very useful, they often are not as effective at removing milk as a standard double electric pump. This can lead to low milk supply, clogged ducts, and mastitis.

Regional West Physicians Clinic-Women's Center and Regional West's Birth and Infant Care Center can help you get a breast pump before your delivery. Community Pharmacy carries Spectra S1 pumps, which are covered by all insurance carriers aside from Medicaid. If you cannot get a pump before having your baby, the Birth and Infant Care Center has a small supply of Spectra S1 pumps.

If you prefer a different type of pump, we also utilize Aeroflow Breastpumps. To see if you are eligible for insurance coverage, visit Aeroflow Breastpumps' website and fill out their online application. Their website offers great resources to help you compare breast pumps and choose the pump that's best for you. Aeroflow is often covered by Medicaid. If insurance does not cover

an Aeroflow breastpump, please let your provider know so we can find the best way to get you a pump. Scan the QR code at the bottom of this page to go to the Aeroflow Breastpumps website. If you are eligible for WIC, they offer loaned breast pumps without insurance. If you have private insurance or Medicaid, WIC uses Milk Works to provide Spectra S2 pumps.
